





About the Programme

Film Composers Lab is a professional development scheme for early-career composers with an interest in composition for screen. Delivered by the Royal Scottish National Orchestra (RSNO), the programme builds on the success of the RSNO's Composers' Hub initiative, delivered annually between 2015 and 2022.

Film Composers Lab offers five emerging UK-based composers an invaluable opportunity to expand their skills in film composition by rescoring an existing short film while working directly with a professional orchestra, project mentors, experienced film composers and seasoned screen industry professionals, creating a brand-new composition for a full symphony orchestra. Delivered in a hybrid format, the project will culminate in a workshop at the RSNO's world-class recording facility, Scotland's Studio, in May 2026. All five new scores will be programmed at a special public screening in the summer of 2026, where one work will be selected to be showcased during the RSNO's 2026:27 Season.

Activity and Dates

Participants will take part in masterclasses with industry experts – providing insights into all aspects of composing for film, from the director-composer relationship to orchestration and budgeting – while working on their new compositions. Each participant will have a 1:1 mentoring session with award-winning film and TV composer John Lunn (*Downton Abbey, The Last Kingdom, Shetland*). Co-mentor Danai Kokogia will be on hand to provide regular support and advice to participants throughout the project. There will be two opportunities for participants to record their scores with RSNO musicians at Scotland's Studio in Glasgow. Activities will be delivered in a hybrid format between November 2025 and May 2026, with the key dates that composers need to commit to as follows:

Project Facilitators



Lead Mentor: John Lunn

Emmy-winning composer John Lunn, best known for his scores for British television, will act as lead mentor for the Film Composers Lab, guiding participants' experience and providing targeted mentorship during the programme. Lunn has composed the scores for such critically acclaimed series as *Hamish Macbeth*, *Bleak House*, *Shetland* and *The Last Kingdom*. After acting as sole composer of the BBC series *Downton Abbey* during its six-season run, he returned to score the 2019 and 2022 film sequels.



Associate Co-Mentor: Danai Kokogia

London-based Greek composer Danai Kokogia specialises in orchestral and hybrid music for film and video games. As of 2024, Danai is composing the orchestral score for an upcoming video game while simultaneously acting as an assistant to BAFTA and Ivor Novello nominated composer David Housden on scores such as Disney Illusion Island. Previous projects include an animated commercial for Taco Bell, feature film Geal, and award-winning animated short Layers of Fear.



Film Industry Consultant: Holly Daniel

Holly Daniel is a film festival consultant and talent development project manager with a long track record of supporting new and emerging film talent. She currently oversees the Industry programme and market at the Red Sea International Film Festival and curates events for Women in Film & TV in Scotland. Holly was Executive Producer for the Scottish Film Talent Network for 6 years and is now joint Programme Director for the Screen Scotland Talent Builder initiative TAKE THREE which supports short filmmakers in Scotland from early career through to feature film readiness. Holly has worked with the RSNO on their Film Composers Lab since its inception and curates the film industry related elements of the programme.



Masterclass Leaders: Film and Music Industry Professionals

Participants will take part in a series of masterclasses, providing industry insights into the creative, practical, and business elements of composing for screen. Curated by the programme's Film Industry Consultant Holly Daniel, these sessions will be delivered by established UK and international composers, film directors, music supervisors, orchestrators and producers, as well as members of the RSNO Artistic Team and staff.



Eligibility Criteria

We welcome applications from everyone, regardless of ethnicity, heritage, gender, sexuality, religion, disability, or socio-economic background, and would particularly encourage individuals from groups currently underrepresented in the field of composition to apply. The only specific eligibility criteria are that applicants must be:

- Based in the UK
- A current PRS member (or applying member)
- In the early stages of their career, with some experience of composing for picture
- Experience in preparing orchestral scores and parts is preferred

Travel/Accommodation Bursaries

Support for all participants

This programme is designed to be available to any early-career composer resident in the UK. For the in-person days in Glasgow, we will provide travel and accommodation bursaries to all participants (up to a maximum of £1250 over the course of the programme) to ensure that their participation in the Film Composers Lab is financially sustainable.
