Job Title: RSNO Community Singing Leader – Dundee

Reports to: Engagement Delivery Manager

Term: 1 - 1.5 days per week, 6 months fixed-term

Fee: £5,505

We are seeking an enthusiastic and experienced Community Singing Leader to deliver a vibrant programme of community singing activity in Dundee. This includes leading **Generations**, an intergenerational singing project; **Youth Singing Workshops** in primary schools; and **Buggy Choir**, a welcoming choir for parents/carers and their babies (up to 12 months). The role is central to fostering musical engagement, community connection, and vocal development across diverse age groups.

RSNO Overview

The RSNO is Scotland's national symphony orchestra and one of the five National Performing Companies, supported by the Scottish Government. The RSNO is a symbol of Scottish cultural excellence. Established in 1891, it continues to deliver the highest quality musical experience and enjoyment throughout Scotland, which has been shared by generations.

RSNO Buggy Choir

Following the success of the Glasgow programme, RSNO Buggy Choir Dundee will launch in January 2026. This is an un-auditioned choir based in the city centre, where new parents/carers come together in a relaxed environment with their babies to partake in adult-focused group singing (that babies will enjoy too!) to boost emotional and mental wellbeing. Buggy Choir provides an opportunity to focus on self-care and wellbeing at a time when caring for yourself as a parent is vital.

RSNO Youth Singing Workshops

An eight-week initiative designed to enrich singing opportunities for children in Dundee. Through engaging, curriculum-aligned workshops for primary pupils, the project supports vocal development, builds musical confidence, and provides teachers with high-quality resources and training supported by Dundee IMS Kodály Music Specialists. It aims to inspire a love of singing in young learners.

RSNO Generations

Generations is an eight-week creative music-making project aimed at encouraging intergenerational connections between Age Meeting Centre Scotland members and primary school pupils. Through activities such as singing, movement, instrumental play and storytelling, participants engage in collaborative artistic expression, building friendships and strengthening community ties. This role will be supported by a mentor. Continued development of a transferable model for similar future initiatives is a key aspect of this project.

RSNO Chorus Academy

Established in 2023, following on from the success of the RSNO Chorus Academy Glasgow which was formed in 2015, the RSNO Chorus Academy Dundee is an un-auditioned singing group open to all that provides the opportunity for amateur singers to sing as part of a chorus. The group meets weekly during the RSNO Season with a focus on building confidence in all aspects of singing, including choral techniques, singing techniques and musicianship, all enhanced by a strong social and wellbeing focus. Please note, Chorus Academy is not part of the remit for this vacancy. Information has been included to provide a full overview of the RSNO's singing activity in Dundee.

Key Responsibilities

- Lead the delivery and development of community singing activities in Dundee, including:
 - Buggy Choir: Weekly choir sessions for parents/carers and babies.
 - Youth Singing Workshops: In-school singing workshops and resource development for P3–P5 pupils.
 - **Generations**: Intergenerational singing sessions bringing together older adults and children in Angus.
- Collaborate with the Engagement team to plan and grow participation in each strand.
- Design and deliver engaging, age-appropriate, and inclusive vocal sessions.
- Select and arrange suitable repertoire tailored to each group's needs and abilities.
- Lead vocal warm-ups, technique exercises and creative singing activities.
- Support participants' vocal development and confidence in a nurturing environment.
- Work with the Community Chorus and Partnerships Coordinator to manage communications, logistics, and materials.
- Contribute to the planning of informal sharing events and public performances as directed by the Engagement team.

Excellent interpersonal and communication skills. Creative, energetic and empathetic approach to group leadership. Ability to foster a welcoming, inclusive and joyful singing environment. Understanding of the Curriculum for Excellence and experience in developing resources for primary year groups (Desirable)
Other	 Passion for community music and inclusive arts engagement. Willingness to work flexible hours, including daytime sessions and occasional weekends. PVG Scheme membership (or willingness to obtain).

- 15 minutes for an informal interview with members of the panel.
